Bridge Central London Skills Partnership Digital case study: St Charles Catholic Sixth Form College (SCCSFC)

The Bridge LSIF project catalysed transformational change within the Creative Media Arts department at SCCSFC. In response to a rapidly evolving creative economy, the College embarked on a bold and ambitious journey to enhance its delivery capacity, digital capabilities, and collaborative partnerships. The result is a reimagined offer, a culture shift from delivering to innovating, and the transformation of separate departments into one creative community.

With LSIF support, the department has integrated immersive and digital production technologies into everyday teaching. From green-screen filming to editing with industry-standard software such as DaVinci Resolve and Adobe Creative Suite, learners gain fluency in essential tools across the sector.

Learners now have access to skills, opportunities, and pathways that reflect the realities of today's creative industries. The project has had a broader impact on the community by engaging underrepresented learners, showcasing diverse voices, and providing a platform for them to explore their identities and experiences. It has empowered staff, opened doors to partnerships and progression, and repositioned the College as a hub for creative excellence in West London.
